Students will further their mastery of Czech grammatical structures and develop vocabulary sufficient to discuss areas of personal interest with ease and to accomplish a wide range of communicative tasks.

## **CZECH 1134 - Intermediate Czech II (4 Credits)**

The purpose of this course is for students to improve their intermediate proficiency in reading, writing, speaking and understanding the Czech language while expanding their knowledge of Czech geography, history, culture, and the way Czech people live today. Students will further their mastery of Czech grammatical structures and develop vocabulary and fluency sufficient to discuss some abstract and specialized topics as well as their own experiences, opinions and ambitions, and to achieve an ever broader and more complex range of competencies in Czech.
