# ATTENDANCE AND CLASS MEETING TIMES

### Attendance

Students are expected to attend all course meetings throughout the term. While some courses enforce penalties for absences, others focus on students' responsibility for class material rather than physical presence. Attendance rules are set by the unit or the instructor.

In accordance with Section 224-a of the New York State Education Law, any student who is absent from school because of religious beliefs must be given an equivalent opportunity to enroll in classes or make up any examinations, study, or work requirements that may have been missed because of such absence on any particular day or days. No fees of any kind shall be charged by the university for making available such equivalent opportunities. In order to facilitate preparation of makeup exams, students intending to be absent in order to observe religious holidays are requested to notify the instructor by the end of the first full week of classes.

# **Class Meeting Times**

In accordance with the Faculty Handbook (https:// deanoffaculty.cornell.edu/policies-procedures/faculty-handbook/6academic-policies-and-responsibilities/#Instruction) and Academic and Events Scheduling Policy (https://dbp.cornell.edu/wp-content/ uploads/2023/09/AES-Policy\_2023\_August.pdf), faculty must work with their department chairperson to make every effort to comply with standard class meeting times. Only when local resolution proves impossible may the faculty member request, in writing, an exception. Non-standard meeting pattern requests may be submitted through the Office of the University Registrar class scheduling system. ## **Free Time Zone**

The Faculty Handbook defines the "free-time zone" to be Mondays through Thursdays from 4:25pm to 7:30pm, Fridays after 4:25pm, Saturdays after 12:05pm, and all day Sunday. The idea is to create a dependable space for relaxation and extracurricular activities.

Graduate-level courses can meet during the free-time zone unless they are cross-listed with or co-meet with undergraduate-level courses. Undergraduate-level courses, or course combinations that include any undergraduate course, are generally not allowed to meet during the freetime zone.

It is important that the intent of the free-time-zone policy be respected during the process of course scheduling. For that reason, the scope of teaching in the free-time zone will be reviewed annually.
